



SAVE SOUTH AFRICA NATIONAL SHUTDOWN

Save South Africa called its first National Shutdown on 8 August, in partnership with Future South Africa and a number of other civil society groups, labour organisations and organised business.

The shutdown included marches in Cape Town and Nelson Mandela Bay and a rally in Johannesburg, and showed how support for Save South Africa – and its campaign to get rid of Jacob Zuma -- continues to increase.

The national shutdown was unique in that it united civil society, labour, business and faith-based groups around a common objective, and we aim to build on this unity to ensure that civil society sets the tone for public conversations around the future of South Africa – particularly as the nation approaches the 2019 elections.

Save South Africa will be working closely with Future South Africa in coming months to increase the impact of protests to stop state capture and reclaim the state – as well as our own programme of action based on our minimum demands for a socially just South Africa (<http://savesouthafrica.org/>).

We are also planning legal action against key figures in the state capture project, to make sure they are held accountable for the continued looting of state-owned companies and the abuse of power.
